Little Swan, a Pas de Deux, inspired by the life of ballerina Anna Pavlova, was named Best of PlayGround-LA and subsequently published. Tofurkey Day has been produced in Florida (Girl Play, named Best of the Fest), LA, Chicago, San Diego, and the UK. Her dark comedy Don't Shoot the Messenger Pigeon opens in Florida this November, while Walking After Midnight, her fantasy-free retelling of Cinderella, will premiere in Texas this December. Roy Proctor - Roy wrote his first play in 2012 after retiring from a 30-year career as the staff theater and art critic on the two daily newspapers in Richmond, Va. Since then, he has completed four full-length plays and 43 short plays in addition to audio adaptations. They have been either fully produced or presented as staged readings in London, Cambridge, Bristol, Bath, Cardiff and Sheffield (in October 2015) in the UK as well as in New York City, Washington, Richmond, Raleigh, New Orleans, Seattle, Los Angeles, San Diego, Charleston (S.C.), South Bend (Ind.) and Edinboro (Pa.). Two have been published. Four are being produced for broadcast and/or podcast by radio theaters in NYC, San Francisco and San Diego. Three of his Chekhov short story adaptations, collectively titled "Russian Roulette: Shots for Chekhov!," were part of England's Bath Fringe Festival in May and June 2015.
